Hyperscale Gravity: Why Everything Orbits NVIDIA

- The AI data-center stack is consolidating around NVIDIA—Alibaba plugs in ex-China while hyperscalers (OpenAI, xAI, CoreWeave, Nebius) standardize on NVDA.
- OpenAl dual-sources—AMD 6 GW + NVDA ≥10 GW LOI; AMD eyes Intel U.S.
- This Week's DR Pick: NOVOB80 with TP of THB2.23 (DKK438 at DKK/THB 5.1).

Why the Al Universe Orbits NVIDIA

The AI data-center ecosystem is consolidating around NVIDIA (NVDA80). Alibaba's (BABA80) new partnership—integrating NVIDIA's robotics/embodied-AI stack into Alibaba Cloud's Platform for AI—arrives alongside a global data-center push (Brazil, France, Netherlands first) and underscores that at scale you need a working relationship with NVDA. Even with U.S. export controls limiting certain chips in mainland China, leaders like xAI, CoreWeave, Nebius—and increasingly OpenAI as it shifts from "AI lab" toward "hyperscaler"—anchor on NVIDIA's stack. As Jensen Huang has argued, OpenAI could be a "multi-trillion" company; strategically, Alibaba is positioning to plug into this NVDA-centric network ex-China.

GW Meets 10 GW: The Dual-Source Blueprint Behind OpenAl's Next Leap

To diversify beyond a single vendor, **OpenAI** signed a multi-year deal with **AMD** to deploy **6 GW** of Instinct MI450 GPUs (**initial 1 GW** in 2H26), including milestone-linked warrants that could allow OpenAI to purchase up to ~10% of AMD; the news sent AMD shares up 24% on 6-Oct-25. This builds on the 22-Sep-25, Letter of Intent for **NVDA** with **OpenAI** to construct ≥10 GW of NVIDIA-powered data centers, with up to ~\$100 b of investment as capacity rolls out. Dual-sourcing de-risks supply, but on total cost of ownership (performance per watt and per dollar), **NVIDIA still leads today**.

All Roads Lead to Intel: Tariffs and the Return of U.S. Foundries

AMD is said to be in early talks with Intel to manufacture some chips at Intel's U.S. fabs. Though Intel's process roadmap still trails **TSMC**, the move grants AMD optionality—especially in a climate of tariffs, export control risk, and onshoring pressure. In particular, Trump-era policies and the drive to repatriate semiconductor manufacturing favor domestic fabs—a dynamic that helps explain federal backing for Intel and NVIDIA's reported ~\$5b investment into the company—hence why the industry keeps circling Intel.

The Next Lens: Apple Refocuses from Headset to Smart Glasses

Bloomberg reports that **Apple** has **paused further Vision Pro** development to shift engineering toward **smart glasses**. Two models are in the works: a display-less version that pairs with iPhone (targeting a **2026** debut, broader release by **2027**) and a display-equipped model originally slated for **2028** but now fast-tracked, featuring cameras, speakers, and deep Al/voice interaction. The broader market is converging on this form factor as well—Google is moving into smart glasses, and **Meta's new Ray-Ban Display** glasses underscore the pace of competition.

This Week's DR Pick: NOVOB80 with TP of THB2.23 (DKK438 at DKK/THB 5.1)

We reiterate **NOVOB80** as our weekly **DR pick (TP THB2.23)** on a **turnaround setup**. After 2023–1H25 shortages—plus compounded GLP-1s and non-FDA copies siphoning cash-pay demand—NVO cut guidance twice in 2025, changed CEOs, and announced ~9k layoffs, driving a ~54% 1Y drop. **The backdrop now looks steadier**: oral Wegovy is showing injection-like weight loss with an FDA decision due in 4Q25, and true generics are unlikely before the 2030s+, preserving GLP-1 leaders' moats. Net-net, risk/reward skews favorable into the catalyst path.

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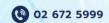
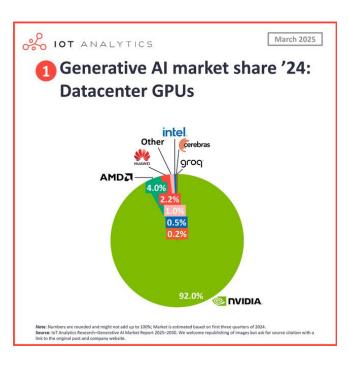




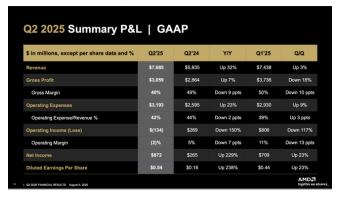


Exhibit 1: Generative Al, Datacenter GPU market share



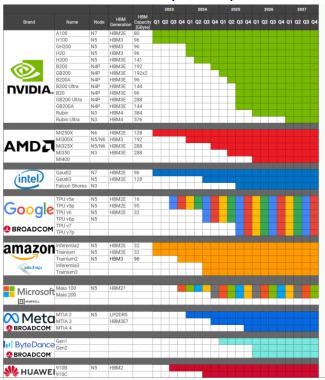

Exhibit 3: AMD's 2Q25 Financial



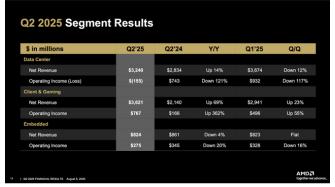

Exhibit 2: Data Center Al Chip Roadmap

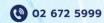

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RECOMMENDATION STRUCTURE

Stock Recommendations

Stock ratings are based on absolute upside or downside, which we define as (target price* - current price) / current price.

BUY: Expected return of 10% or more over the next 12 months.
